Smile Keepers Dental Program

▲ Providing essential basic dental care to young children is another one of First 5 Amador's priorities. This year, **more than 200 children** in the county received oral health screenings and fluoride varnish treatments. And **125 caregivers** received education regarding oral health.

Plus 12 new Family Resource Center staff were trained in oral health education and data collection.
